INTRODUCTION


This publication reports information for a total of 83 indicators focused on children, adolescents and young people in Albania. Most of the indicators are refined and reported here for the first time. To develop the indicators, best international practices were taken as reference during the process. The data source is a combination of administrative data reported by the respective state institutions and surveys conducted by INSTAT.

This publication includes chapters focused as follows:

- Chapter One presents indicators for a range of areas with comparative data from the timeframe 2016–2018. Beyond a graphical presentation of the trend over the years, this chapter provides a description of the indicators with respective sources for the data.
- Chapter Two maps all potential indicators for Sustainable Development Goals focused on children, adolescents and youth. The data represent the latest available information, as the goal is specifically aimed at identifying the reporting status of the indicators.
- The Appendix of the publication provides more information on the absolute values of the indicators, as well as in some cases more extensive data for specific indicators.
- The publication represents a starting point on a long journey, aiming to improve official data on children and youth in Albania. In the context of implementing the current regulatory framework, INSTAT, in cooperation with the responsible institutions, aims to update annually the list of indicators and the corresponding data periodically. This means continuous collaboration between INSTAT and the responsible reporting institutions to ensure the quality of the data and the regularity of their reporting.
- Expanding the existing list with inclusion of other indicators representative of a wider range of areas of child welfare, as well as ensuring updated data for each indicator, aims to promote further their use in the function of effective decision making in the best interest of children and youth in Albania. The audience interested in children, adolescents and youth welfare is expected to include state institutions, in their functions of planning, monitoring and evaluating measures, plans and reforms focused on children and youth. Other members of the potential interested audience include independent institutions, international organisations, local non-governmental organisations, academics and other individuals working in the field of children's rights.
- Furthermore, the publication of these indicators will facilitate the comparability of the status of compliance of children's rights in Albania with other countries of the region and beyond.




Children, adolescents and youth as ratio to the entire population

Gross fertility rate




Explanation: The ratio of the live births with the average population, expressed as a rate per 1,000 inhabitants (same calendar year) Source: INSTAT





Rate of abortion for 1,000 women, by age



Rate of abortion for 1,000 live births, by age





Child mortality, by age groups








Enrolled students per 1,000 population


Gross graduation ratio in upper secondary


Percentage of children, victims of criminal offenses


