

# **Transport statistics\***

#### **April 2022**

**Tirana, 27 May 2022:** The volume of freights loading/unloading in ports, in April 2022 is 425.8 thousand / tonnes, decreasing 5.7 % compared to April 2021.

In the first four months of 2022, the volume of freights loading/unloading in ports is 1,426.3 thousand / tonnes, decreasing by 6.9 % compared to the first four months of 2021.

The volume of freights transported by rail in April 2022 is 1,658 thousand / tonnes – km, decreased by 28.9 % compared to April 2021.

In the first four months of 2022, volume of freights transported by rail is 6,738 thousand tonnes-km, decreasing by 38.4 % compared to the first four months of 2021.

In April 2022, the volume of freights transported by air is 174.0 tonnes, increasing by 8.2 % compared to April 2021.

In the first four months of 2022, the volume of freights transported by air is 656.3 tonnes, increasing by 7.5 % compared to the first quarter of year 2021.

In April 2022, the number of flights is 2,966, increased by 2.5 times, compared to April 2021.

In April 2022, the number of passengers traveling by sea line is 53,925 passengers. Compared to April 2021, this indicator increased 77.3 %. In the first four months of 2022, 175,274 passengers travelled by sea line, increased 47.6 % compared to same period of 2021.

In April 2022, the number of passengers traveling by rail is 1,917 passengers. Compared to April 2021, this indicator increased by 4.6 times. In the first four months of 2022, 5,744 passengers travelled by rail, increasing by 3.6 times compared to same period of 2021.

In April 2022, passenger air transport occupies 87.4 % of the total transport.

In April 2022, the number of passengers traveling by air is 386,444 passengers, increased by 3.8 times compared to April 2021.

In the first four months of 2022, the number of passengers traveling by air line is 1,147,270 passengers, increasing by 3.3 times, compared to the first four months of 2021.

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### Exports/Imports of goods by mode of transport

In April 2022, the value of goods traded (exports and imports) is 119.9 billion ALL where 50.0 % of them is transported by sea.

In the first four months of 2022, value of goods traded (exports and imports) is 447.3 billion ALL where 51.0 % of them is transported by sea.

# **Exports of goods**

In April 2022, goods exported by sea represent 55.9 %, by land 37.3 % and by air 0.2 % of total exports of goods. Goods exported by land increased by 32.9 %, compared with the same period of 2021.



In the first four months of 2022, goods exported by sea represent 56.1 %, by land 34.8 % and by air 0.2 %. Goods exported by land increased by 42.1 % compared to same period of 2021.

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### Imports of goods

In April 2022, goods imported by sea represent 46.8 %, by land 45.0 % and by air 2.0 %. Goods imported by land in April 2022 increased by 11.6 %, compared to April 2021.



In the first four months of 2022, goods imported by sea represented 48.1 %, by land 43.2 % and by air 2.3 %. Goods imported by land increased by 14.1 % compared with the same period of 2021.

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# Methodology

The Publication of Transport Statistics presents the results on the transport of goods and passengers by type, as well as the export and import of goods by mode of transport, on a monthly basis. The data are administrative. The main source of information is the Ministry of Infrastructure and Energy and General Directorate of Customs.

#### **Definitions**

Airlines: Companies that transport passengers and goods.

**Transport**: Movement of people and / or freights using various means of transport. Transport is carried out by land, air and sea means.

Rail transport: Every movement of freights and /or passengers using wheeled vehicles run on the track.

Land transport: Any movement of goods using a road vehicle on a given road network.

**Maritime transport**: Any movement of goods and / or passengers using commercial vessel trips, which are undertaken wholly or partly by sea.

**Air transport**: Any movement of freights and / or passengers using aircraft on trips, which are undertaken wholly or partly by air.

**Exports**: Goods destined to a third country, placed under customs export or outward processing arrangements or re-exported following inward processing.

**The FOB (free on board)**: Value of exports of goods is the value of the goods at the exporter's customs frontier.

**Imports:** Goods arrived from a third country and are directly placed, or are left in warehouse, under customs procedure of release for free circulation, inward processing or processing under customs control.

The cost, insurance and frnine (CIF): Price of a good delivered at the frontier of the importing country, or the price of a service delivered to resident, before the payment of any import duties or other taxes on imports or trade and transport margins within the country.

**NST 2007:** A statistical nomenclature for the goods transported by four modes of transport: road, rail, inland waterways and sea (maritime).

The data of maritime, rail and air transport are preliminary and subject to revision. For more refer: Statistical revision policy.
