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
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Foreign Trade in Goods

November 2022

Tirana, December 19, 2022: On November 2022 the value of exports was ALL 42 billion, increasing by 12.9 % compared with the same period of previous year and by 10.2 % compared with October 2022. The value of imports was ALL 77 billion, decreasing by -3.9 % compared with the same period of previous year and by -7.1 % compared with October 2022. This month the trade deficit is ALL 35 billion, decreasing by -18.5 % compared with November 2021 and by -21.8 % compared with October 2022.



In the first eleven months of 2022, the value of exports was ALL 447 billion, increasing by 32.6 %, compared with previous year and the value of imports was ALL 856 billion, increasing by 20.1 % compared with previous year. Trade deficit was ALL 409 billion, increasing by 8.8 % compared with the same period of 2021.

The influence of the main groups in the annual change in exports:

In annual increase of exports by 12.9 % this month, a positive contribution was given by the groups: "Mineral, fuels, electricity" with +6.2 percentage point, "Textile and footwear" with +5.5 percentage point and "Machinery, equipment and spare parts" with +3.0 percentage point. While a negative contribution was given by the group: "Construction materials and metals" with -4.7 percentage point.





Fig.2 Contribution of groups in annual change of exports November 2022

Exports during the first eleven months of 2022 are increased by 32.6 % compared with the same period of previous year. The main groups that influenced more in annual increase of exports are: "Mineral, fuels, electricity" with +9.7 percentage point, "Construction materials and metals" with +7.7 percentage point, and "Textile and footware" with +6.5 percentage point.

The influence of the main groups in the annual change in imports:

In annual decrease of imports by -3.9 %, this month has mainly affected the groups: "Minerals, fuels, electricity" with -8.2 percentage point, "Food, beverages, tobacco" with -0.6 percentage point and "Leather and leather manufacturing" with -0.2 percentage point. While a positive contribution was given by the groups: "Machinery, equipment and spare parts" with +2.6 percentage point and "Construction materials and metals" with +1.6 percentage point.

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In the first eleven months of 2022, imports are increased by 20.1 % compared with the same period of previous year. The groups affected positivity in annual increase of imports, are: "Mineral, fuels, electricity" with +8.2 percentage point, "Construction materials and metals" with +3.8 percentage point and "Food, beverages, tobacco" with +2.7 percentage point.


The performance of trade in goods by partner countries

In November 2022, countries with which Albania has had the highest increase of exports, compared to November 2021 are: Italy (11.1 %), Spain (74.1 %) and Macedonia (68.3 %). While, countries with which has had a decrease of imports are: Kosovo (9.3 %), Greece (4.0 %) and China (26.6 %).

In the first eleven months of 2022, countries with which Albania has had the highest increase of exports, compared to the same period of 2021 are: Italy (38.6 %), Germany (67.6 %) and Greece (18.5 %). While, countries with which has had a decrease of imports are: Kosovo (1.1 %) and Spain (6.2 %).

In November 2022, countries with which Albania has had the highest increase of imports, compared to November 2021 are: Italy (5.2 %), Greece (24.9 %), and Macedonia (24.3 %). While, countries with which has had a decrease of imports are: Turkey (14.8 %), China (13.4 %) and Germany (5.6 %).

In the first eleven months or 2022, countries with which Albania has had the highest increase of imports, compared to the same period of 2021 are: Italy (7.4 %), Turkey (36.9 %) and Greece (22.4 %). While, countries with which has had a decrease of imports are: USA (11.2 %), Russia (20.9 %) and Switzerland (34.0 %).

Exports

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Trade with the EU countries is 61.3 % of total trade. In November 2022, exports to EU countries occuped 75.1 % of total export and imports from EU countries occuped 53.7 % of total import. The main trade partners remain: Italy (30.4 %), Turkey (9.3 %), China (5.9 %), and Greece (5.7 %).

Trade with the EU countries, in the first eleven months of 2022 is 59.8 % of total trade. In this period, the share of exports to EU countries was 74.0 % of total export and share of imports from EU countries was 52.3 % of total import. The main trade partners are: Italy (29.5 %), Turkey (8.5 %), Greece (7.0 %) and Germany (6.4 %).

Methodology

Exports are goods destined to a third country. placed under customs export or outward processing arrangements or re-exported following inward processing.

The FOB (free on board) value of exports of goods is the value of the goods at the exporter's customs frontier.

Imports are goods arrived from a third country and are directly placed. or are left in warehouse. under customs procedure of release for free circulation. inward processing or processing under customs control.

The cost, insurance and freight (CIF) price is the price of a good delivered at the frontier of the importing country, or the price of a service delivered to resident, before the payment of any import duties or other taxes on imports or trade and transport margins within the country.

Combined Nomenclature (CN) is a goods nomenclature used by international trade in goods statistics and for customs tariffs.
