

# CONSUMER PRICE INDEX



**February 2012**

**C**onsumer Price Index (CPI), in February 2012, resulted 113.7 percent against December 2007 (December 07=100), signing an increase of 1.3 percent against the previous month.

**T**he annual rate in February is 0.6 percent. A year before the annual rate was also 4.5 percent.

**T**he index of "Food and non-alcoholic beverage" signed an increase by 2.2 percent. Within this group the highest increase by 13.0 percent it was notice in the "vegetables include potatoes" subgroup. Here can be mentioned the increase prices of tomatoes by 36.0 percent, cucumber by 21.7 percent, pepper by 21.2 percent, fresh leek by 6.7 percent, dried onion by 4.4 percent, etc. The index of "fruit" subgroup signed an increase by 4.5 percent, where can be mentioned the increase prices of mandarin by 22.1 percent, lemons by 11.2 percent, apples by 5.6 percent, banana by 3.3 percent, etc. Price in February in some other subgroup of this group are decrease, where can be mentioned decreases in the subgroups "sugar and desert" by 0.4 percent, "milk, cheese and eggs" by 0.1 percent, etc.

**T**he index of "Alcoholic beverage and tobacco" group, signed an increase by 0.2 percent. This is mainly as result of increase prices of alcoholic beverage.

**T**he index of "Clothing and footwear" group, signed a decrease by 0.5 percent.

**T**he index of "Rent, water fuel and power" group signed an increase by 0.5 percent, where can be mention increase tariffs of drinking water by 10.6 percent and price of fuel by 0.5 percent.

**T**he index of "Transport" signed an increase by 0.8 percent. In February price of diesel signed an increase by 1.7 percent and price of petrol an increase by 1.9 percent.


**T**he index of "Goods and various services" group signed an increase by 6.1 percent. Within this group the tariffs of car are doubled.



**METHODOLOGICAL EXPLANATION**

Consumer Price Index (CPI) is calculated with a new basket of product from January 2008. Weights are based on the results of the Household Budget Survey, carried out during October 2006 – September 2007.

December 2007 is considered as the base period (December 2007 = 100)

Previous change of the product basket was from January 2002, where the number of the products was increased from 221 to 262 products.

In the new basket the number of product is 272.

The international classification, COICOP, with 12 main groups was introduced to the previous product basket and it will continue to be used with the new product basket.

The index will cover all Albanian (rural and urban) territory. The previous index covered only the urban area.

The product weights will be different for each region.

Prices are collected in main cities of 11 prefectures were Kukes is within the prefecture of Diber.

The Consumer Price Index of Albania is a Laspeyres type index:

$$I_{0,i}^t = \frac{\sum_i P_i^t * Q_i^0}{\sum_i P_i^0 * Q_i^0}$$

With weights ( $w = P * Q$ ) from base period this is approximated to:

In more detail, a price relative is calculated for each item and region with geometrical mean on the sample of outlets:

Monthly chaining gives the price relative from the base period:

The price relatives are aggregated geographically to form product indices on items for whole Albania:

Aggregation over items then gives the CPI of Albania:
