Demographic indicators

Second quarter of 2017

Tiranë, on 26 September 2017: During the second quarter of 2017, the number of births over passes with 1,563 the number of deaths.

The population natural increase on the second quarter of 2017 shows a decrease by 32.6 % compared to the second quarter of 2016.





Fig. 1 Natural increase of population

The population natural increase on the second quarter of 2017, in 12 prefectures of Albania, registered the highest value in Tirana prefecture, where the number of births over passes with 936 the number of deaths. The Durrës prefecture have high population natural increase, with 216 births more than deaths, followed by Dibër prefecture with 199 births more than deaths.

The negative value of the natural increase on the second quarter of 2017 is registered only in three prefectures (Gjirokastër, Vlorë dhe Korçë). The lowest value is registered in Gjirokastër and Vlorë prefecture, where the number of deaths over passes with 110 the number of births.







Births

The number of births is 6,234 on the second quarter of 2017, by experiencing a decrease by 15.4 % compared to the second quarter of 2016.

The lowest number of births is registered in Gjirokastër prefecture, 83 births, by experiencing a decrease by 36.6 % compared to the second quarter of 2016. The highest number of births is registered in Tirana prefecture with 2,013 births, by experiencing a decrease by 8.8 % compared to the second quarter of 2016.

The number of births on the second quarter of 2017 has experienced decrease compared to the second quarter of 2016 on all prefectures. The prefecture of Gjirokastër notes the highest decreased of number of births during this period with 36.6 %, followed by Vlorë prefecture with 30.3 %.

Deaths

The number of deaths is 4,671 on the second quarter of 2017, by experiencing a decrease by 7.4 % compared to the second quarter of 2016.

The highest number of deaths is registered in Tirana prefecture with 1,077 deaths, by experiencing a decrease by 8.7 % compared to the second quarter of 2016. The number of deaths on the second quarter of 2017 is decreased almost in every prefecture compared to the second quarter of 2016. Fier prefecture is an exception, where the number of deaths increased by 3.8 %, compared to the second quarter of 2016.

The Lezhë prefecture notes the highest decreased with 25.5 %. The number of deaths on the second quarter of 2017 experienced high decrease more than 10.0 % in the Dibër prefecture with 13.2 %, and Shkodër prefecture with 12.8 %, compared to the second quarter of 2016.

Methodology note

Definition:

Population natural increase: Expresses the increase/decrease of the population as a result of the biological processes (births and deaths) over a period of time. It is expressed as the difference between the live births to deaths.

Live birth: Births of children that showed any sign of life.

Death: Means the permanent disappearance of all evidence of life at any time after life birth has taken place (postnatal cessation of vital functions without capability of resuscitation).

Data source: The data are provided from General Directorate of Civil Registration.
