

# Transport statistics\*

### **April 2021**

Tirana, 27 May 2021: The volume of freight loading/unloading in ports, in April 2021 is 451.6 thousand / tonnes, increasing 27.7 % compared to April 2020. Compared with the monthly average for April period 2018-2020, the volume of freight loading/unloading in ports increased by 24.6 %,

In the first four months of 2021, the volume of freight loading/unloading in ports is 1,531.9 thousand / tonnes, increasing by 18.1 % compared to the first four months of 2020.

The volume of freight transported by rail in April 2021 is 2,333 thousand / tonnes – km increasing 3.1 times compared to April 2020. The volume of freight transported by rail increased by 30.5 %, compared with monthly average for April period 2018-2020.

In the first four months of 2021, volume of freights transported by rail is 10,436 thousand tonnes-km, increasing by 11.1 % compared to the first four months of year 2020.

In April 2021, the volume of freights transported by air is 161 tonnes, increasing 2 times compared to April 2020. Compared with monthly average for April period 2018-2020, the volume of freight transported by air increased by 4.9 %.

In the first four months of 2021, the volume of freights transported by air is 610 tonnes, increasing by 3.2 % compared to the first four months of year 2020.

In April 2021, the number of flights is 1,204 increasing 7.9 times compared to April 2020. Compared with monthly average for April period 2018-2020, the number of flights decreased by 16.4 %.

In April 2021, the number of passengers traveling by sea line is 30,413 passengers. Compared to April 2020, this indicator increased 9.6 times. Compared with monthly average for April period 2018-2020, the number of passengers traveling by sea decreased by 33.4 %.

In the first four months of 2021, 118,715 passengers travelled by sea, decreased by 8.0 % compared to same period of 2020.

In April 2021, passenger air transport occupies 76.7 % of the total transport.

In April 2021, the number of passengers traveling by air is 101,354 passengers, increased 25.4 times compared to April 2020. Compared with monthly average for April period 2018-2020, the number of passengers traveling by air decreased by 33.2 %.

In the first four months of 2021, the number of passengers traveling by air line is 342,804 passengers, decreasing by 34.0 % compared to the first four months of year 2020.

### Exports/Imports of goods by mode of transport

In April 2021, the value of goods traded (exports and imports) is 91.6 billion ALL and 46.8 % of them is transported by sea. In the first four months of 2021, value of goods traded (exports and imports) is 334.0 billion ALL and 49.4 % of them is transported by sea.

#### **Exports of goods**

In April 2021, goods exported by sea represent 51.5 %, by road 41.1 % and by air 0.3 % of total exports of goods. Goods exported by road increased by 54.2 % compared with the same period of 2021. Export of goods transported by road in April 2021 increased 23.0 %, compared with monthly average for April period 2018-2020.



In the first four months of 2021, goods exported by sea represent 56.1 %, by road 36.4 % and by air 0.2 %. Goods exported by road increased by 27.1 % compared to same period of 2020.

#### Imports of goods

In April 2021, goods imported by sea represent 44.6 %, by road 49.9 % and by air 4.0 %. Goods imported by road in April 2021 increased by 68.6 % compared to April 2020. Import of goods transported by road in April 2021 increased 40.9 %, compared with monthly average for April period 2018-2020.



In the first four months of 2021, goods imported by sea represented 46.2 %, by road 48.0 % and by air 3.3 %. Goods imported by road increased by 38.2 % compared with the same period of 2020.

# Methodology

The Publication of Transport Statistics presents the results on the transport of goods and passengers by type, as well as the export and import of goods by mode of transport, on a monthly basis. The data are administrative. The main source of information is the Ministry of Infrastructure and Energy and General Directorate of Customs.

#### **Definitions**

Airlines: Companies that transport passengers and goods.

**Transport**: Movement of people and / or freights using various means of transport. Transport April is carried out by land, air and sea means.

Rail transport: Every movement of freights and / passengers using wheeled vehicles run on the track.

**Maritime transport**: Any movement of goods and / or passengers using commercial vessel trips, which are undertaken wholly or partly by sea.

**Air transport**: Any movement of freights and / or passengers using aircraft on trips, which are undertaken wholly or partly by air.

**Exports**: Goods destined to a third country, placed under customs export or outward processing arrangements or re-exported following inward processing.

**The FOB (free on board)**: Value of exports of goods is the value of the goods at the exporter's customs frontier.

**Imports:** Goods arrived from a third country and are directly placed, or are left in warehouse, under customs procedure of release for free circulation, inward processing or processing under customs control.

The cost, insurance and freight (CIF): Price of a good delivered at the frontier of the importing country, or the price of a service delivered to resident, before the payment of any import duties or other taxes on imports or trade and transport margins within the country.

**NST-2007:** A statistical nomenclature for the goods transported by four modes of transport: road, rail, inland waterways and sea (maritime).

The data of maritime, rail and air transport are preliminary and subject to revision. For more refer: <u>Statistical</u> revision policy
