

# List of Public Institutions, 2020

**Tirana, on 14 September 2021:** INSTAT provides the list of public sector institutions that are part of the General Government sector as well as Public Financial Corporations and Public Non-financial Corporations that are owned by public entities for year 2020.

Budgetary spending units of Public Sector consist of the: Central Government sub-sector (S.1311) with 896 budgetary spending units, Local Government sub-sector (S.1313) with 194 budgetary spending units and the Insurance Funds sub-sector (S.1314) with 2 budgetary spending units.

The major revision to the number of budgetary spending units over the years comes as a result of structural changes in the Government, reclassifications, and from new or closed units.

Extra-budgetary units of Public Sector consist of the Central Government sub-sector (S.1311) with 58 spending units and the Local Government sub-sector (S.1313) with 109 spending units.

In addition to the budgetary and extra-budgetary institutions, the public sector includes the Public Non-Financial Corporations sub-sector (S.11001) with 26 units, Public Financial Corporations sub-sector (S.12) with 2 units and the sub-sector of the Central Bank (S.121) with 1 unit.
